

Layout of Map Direct Lite.

Map Direct Lite has a very lean look allowing for a very large map image. Many components are shown by clicking the various chevrons appearing throughout the screen. Click the chevrons to show tools, and click them again to hide tools.





You can find places on the map by using the Search Box.

The Search Box is at the upper right of the map. You can search for many things using the Search Box.

- Address, city or zip code
- Places of Interest, such as Epcot or Tom Brown Park
- Sites and Facilities from data layers currently in the map
 - o Enter the name or ID of the feature to search for it



You can see information about features shown on the map by clicking them.

When you click on the map or use one of the Search Tools to make a selection, the results are shown on the right side panel. You can click an item in the Search Results list to zoom to that place.




You can see the Search Results information in a Table Format.

Click the Table button on the Search Results to see the results in a Table View.





The Search Results Table covers up the map. Click the Close Button to return to the map.



You can change what data is shown on the map.

The Layers Panel on the left side of the map contains the Layer Gallery and the Legend. Click the Show Legend Button and the Show Layers Button to toggle between the two views. Click a Layer Thumbnail in the Layer Gallery to show or hide that data layer on the map.





You can choose the background layer.

The Basemap is a special background layer the map shows underneath all other data layers for context. The map can only have one Basemap layer at a time, although it can show many other data layers on top of that Basemap.

Click the Basemap Toggle Button at the lower left of the map to toggle between the Primary and Secondary Basemaps, which are initially the Topographic Basemap and the Aerial Imagery with Roads Basemap.





Click the Basemap Gallery Button (just to the right of the Basemap Toggle Button) to open the Basemap Gallery of all available Basemaps. Click a Basemap in the Gallery to make it the current Basemap.



You can Save and Share your Map.

You can create and download a PDF of the map by clicking the Print button.



You can save and share your map by clicking the Share this Map Button.



You can visit the Map Direct Galleries (which contains many maps on a wide range of topics) by clicking the Map Direct Button.



You can find Help Documentation and Contact Information by clicking the Help Button.
